## Official Certificates

If you are returning to 6<sup>th</sup> form, your certificates will be held on file until you leave Year 13. If you are leaving WBHS, or would like to collect your certificates early, then they will be available for collection from the Exams Office from 1<sup>st</sup> December 2025. You will need your certificates in the future to present to employers and education providers. **Make sure that you remember to collect your certificates and store them safely.** Certificates are expensive to replace at around £50 per exam board. If you would like someone to collect your certificates on your behalf, they must have a signed letter of authorisation from you. Certificates are kept by the school for five years and then destroyed.
