

One of the key messages we shared during transition was that many of our most successful students are also our busiest. Extra-curricular clubs aren't





This year, you will begin writing *Your Story @ WBHS*. Every club you join, every activity you take part in, and every opportunity you try helps shape your story. Getting involved is one of the best ways to meet new people, build confidence, and discover your strengths. As you take part in extra-curricular activities, you'll be able to record your experiences in your Your Story log, creating a personal record of your journey through school that will grow with you and help you reflect on your achievements along the way.

CLUBS OVERVIEW

We appreciate the importance of extra-curricular activities for students and are proud of not only the number, but the variety of options available to students in the school. Getting involved in wider activities outside of the classroom is important for students' personal development, but are also beneficial for the positive social, physical and mental health impacts.




Do you enjoy Designing and using Technology? Do you want to develop your skills?




Do you LOUE reading?

MUSICALS CLUB


Give 'em the old razzle dazzle!


