



Reform of non-A'level courses

The previous government proposed changes to some post-16 qualifications . These are marked * in the list and are:

Food Science and Nutrition; Sport Studies. These courses are likely to follow similar changes to some subjects, including being renamed as Alternative Academic Qualifications (AAQs).

The government is due to release updates about further reforms to Post 16 education this term. we will keep students and parent/carers updated.

In my spare time I love to play and write music, I also take part in Act 2 Cam, and I am completing a BFI course where we meet up every Sunday, and we will create a film.

For anyone new joining WBH Sixth Form I think it is important to talk to people. In your lessons you have all chosen to do that subject, so you all have similar interests. I think it is important to get a dialogue going and you will soon settle in class.

Although I thought college would feel more independent and a bigger step up from GCSEs, I decided I would get more support and a better routine from WBH Sixth Form.

I thought it wouldn't feel any different staying on and being a Sixth Former, but it does feel vastly different. I do feel more independent, and I am treated more like an adult. I am very pleased I made the decision to stay on at WBH Sixth Form.

I am studying Art, Psychology and English Literature and would like to get into Art Therapy in the future. For Enrichment I will be doing In-class Support. I hope this will link into my future plans of wanting to help people. I'm also part of the Staff and Sixth Form Reading Group. English Literature is something I am passionate about.

Outside of school I do ballet and I also coach. I am also in my 7th year at The People's Theatre dancing in the pantomime at Christmas.

The fact I am doing subjects that I love means that it doesn't feel like work. I know I am working towards my future, and this makes me more motivated. There are lots of spaces to work in while you are studying whether that be the library, Sixth Form centre or one of my favourite places an Art Room, I find these very creative spaces to work.

Sixth Form offers you a lot of independence and one to one support. My advice would be not to hold back and ask questions.



The EPQ requires 90 hours of independent study research.



The EPQ is judged not just on the final project produced, but on the entire process you have undergone.

HOW MANY COURSES & WHAT IS THE EPQ?

With AS qualifications reduced in value and all courses designed to be assessed after two years, we advise all students to take 3 subjects. However, if you have a strong GCSE profile, including two grade 6s (one of which should be in English Literature or Language) you should consider taking the EPQ alongside your main subjects. This will broaden your curriculum by studying another area of interest or allowing you to specialise in a topic beyond the specification.

The EPQ is the Extended Project Qualification. You choose the topic and title and undertake independent research to answer your question. A supervisor will guide you through the process and the independent, academic study skills required. The project can take any form and is worth 50% of an A Level or Level 3 qualification.

A fourth course is permitted. Please discuss this in your guidance meetings.

WHO CAN JOIN THE SIXTH FORM?

Subject to numbers, anyone is welcome to join our Sixth Form, provided they meet our entry criteria and an A Level or equivalent programme is the most appropriate course.

Whether you are joining us from Year 11 at Whitley Bay High or coming from another school, we want to make sure you get all the advice you need. We want to ensure the course you choose is at the right level, will take you in the direction you want to go and that you will be able to manage its demands.

We will help you with these decisions.





ENTRY CRITERIA

Students must have a supportive reference from their current Head of Year which suggests they can meet the demands of an A Level or equivalent course.

Students must achieve a minimum of five 4-9 (or equivalent) grade passes in separate subjects* at GCSE level to start an advanced course. All subjects have specific entry requirements that students must achieve to start that course. (See the Appendix on page 48 of this Prospectus).

(*Some GCSE and BTEC courses, e.g. ICT, Media, Health & Social Care, Business Communications, Engineering etc., will be classed as one subject, even if they are equivalent to more than one GCSE grade. Both English subjects and Double/Triple Science will continue to be classed as separate subjects.)



This is my fourth year in the UK, I moved here from Hong Kong and really feel that the education system is much better here.

I decided WBH Sixth Form was right for me as they had all the courses on offer that I wanted to study and my current high school didn't. I also know that the A Level results are very good which was another reason for moving.


I knew that the transition from GCSE to A Level would be hard as it would be more intense, but I have settled really quickly, and I am enjoying learning all the new content. Seating plans have also helped and are a quick way to get to know everyone in your class so that you feel comfortable with everyone.

I have chosen to study Biology, Chemistry and Maths as I hope to get into veterinary medicine. Ideally, I would love to go to Edinburgh University Vet School, which is currently the best vet school in the UK. I will be going through WBH Sixth Form early entry programme to hopefully get a place.

For enrichment I am trying to secure a work placement that links to becoming a vet, ideally at a farm or slaughterhouse. I have previously had a placement in a vets and think it is important to put myself in a more uncomfortable place, such as a slaughterhouse to gain a full spectrum of experience.

I am also enjoying playing badminton at break and lunchtimes, it is a nice break from my studies and a great way to socialise with friends and meet new people.

I am looking forward to the Biology residential fieldwork trip to Windermere in the summer.




I am enjoying spending time in the library and find this a useful space to go back over my lessons and do any homework prior to going home. I am also enjoying playing badminton a couple of times a week.


I am looking forward to the Biology Fieldtrip next year. We will be going to the Lake District to do sampling as well as getting the opportunity to Kayak and Paddle Board.

The school has been thoughtfully designed with Sixth Form at the centre as a highly visible and aspirational space. In the Sixth Form Study Area there are enhanced facilities which prioritise access to ICT, with areas designed for both group work and independent study. In our lecture theatre students experience presentations from subject specialists and guest speakers. A Sixth Form café is also available to students to access refreshments throughout the day.

Sixth Form students also make full use of our large modern library which provides further access to ICT and is equipped with new multimedia resources and a constantly growing book stock. 

There is a specialised introduction to the library for all Sixth Form students during one of the induction sessions to help students make the most of this excellent facility.

In both the study room and library there is always a lovely atmosphere as students relax and carry out independent study in these informal settings.

STUDYING COMPUTER SCIENCE, DRAMA, ENGLISH LITERATURE, AND MATHS



I was here in lower school and it was an easy decision to stay on for Sixth Form because I have loved my time here. My GCSE courses were all great and I really liked my teachers.

I have chosen to do four subjects at A Level to keep my options open in the future, but I know if they do become too much, I can drop one. I love Drama and hope to maybe do more drama in the future, possibly at university. I have also chosen English Literature. I enjoyed the analysis side at GCSE and my teachers were so inspiring that I felt compelled to take it at A Level. I have also taken Computer Science as I find anything tech related really clicks with my brain. Finally, I chose Maths as I love the logical side, it is either right or wrong.

For enrichment I am doing Music Theory. I am involved in a number of extra-curricular clubs, including Choir, School Production, Musicals Club and I have singing lessons.

THE POST 16 BURSARY

Students who are entering Post 16 education at any institution may be eligible for the Post 16 Bursary which is funded by the government. Its purpose is to help those students who need support in meeting the costs of Post 16 education.

You will qualify for funding if you are any of the following

- · In care
- · A care leaver
- In a family in receipt of income support
- A student with learning difficulties or disabilities in receipt of both Employment Support Allowance and Disability Allowance.

If so you will qualify for £1,200* per year from the scheme



- · Eligible for Free School Meals
- In a family in receipt of Working Tax Credit and with a gross household income of £35,000 or less
- A young person aged 16-18 looking after a sick or disabled relative
- In a family with a gross household income below £35,000

If so you will be eligible to receive up to £700* per year from the scheme.

In addition, any funding that is left will be used as a Hardship Fund for learners experiencing severe financial hardship. If you have any questions about this Bursary please do not hesitate to contact the Sixth Form Team.

THE AMERICAN DREAM - SIMEON SAYER


"The American University application system is very different from that in the UK. I needed to complete a number of different SAT tests to apply but luckily my hard work paid off and I received exceptional grades. I found out six days before my very first A Level that I had been offered an unconditional place. Because I found out so close to my exams I had to quickly put this to the back of my mind so that I could focus on my upcoming A Levels and aim to gain the best possible results I could! Thanks to the help from all my teachers, I was able to get great grades that really set me up for the adventure ahead of me.

I will be staying in Harvard's accommodation, which is specifically set up for first year students and has a similar arrangement to Oxford and Cambridge. At Harvard you do not apply to a specific course and you are able to tailor courses to suit your interests so you can even dictate your own degree title!

I know that I'll be studying within the computer science area. I love the idea that this area of work is constantly evolving and I like the prospect of being at the cutting edge of research which I know I will be exposed to at Harvard.

WBHS Sixth Form team have been very supportive during this process. There was a lot of form filling in, reference writing and time needed for my application. I really believe that school is there to support you through your options after A Levels.

I would recommend others to think wider than the UK as anything is possible, and WBHS sixth form offers the support to help you. The school supported me to be aspirational and helped me to expand my horizons, something I definitely feel I've been able to achieve."


