These pioneering brothers broke the record for unaided rowing across the Pacific ocean this Summer. Discuss the following and make notes in your yellow book.


- 1. What motivated the brothers to perform this incredible feat? Identify at least 3 factors.

# Successful English Students need to develop the following four skills

• To be a Critic



You need to be able to respond to texts that you read and evaluate the ideas and opinions in them as well as the methods the writer uses.

• To understand the writer's craft



You need to be understand the craft of writing and creating texts. This means that you are aware of the language and structural features that writers use.

To be a Curator



You need to gather up and keep returning to key facts and ideas that allow you to learn and understand even more in the future.


• To be Creative




You need to be able to create your own writing – stories, articles, essays, poems, plays, speeches. The three skills above will help you be creative

## Talk regularly with your teen about GCSEs

- 1. Have regular conversations about their learning
- Ask specific questions like:
   "What are you learning in Biology right now?"

"What's going well? What's tricky?"

2. Get them thinking and explaining

Ask for their opinions:"Do you agree with that? Why?"


Ask them to explain ideas:
 "Can you give me an example?"
 "Tell me more – I'm interested."

# Encouraging Practise and Revision

- Why it matters:
- Repeating a skill helps it stick.
- Builds confidence.
- Makes it easier to remember in exams.
- How to help:
- Encourage them to revisit topics regularly.
- Support them with homework and independent study.
- Show interest being involved shows that education is important to you too.






Reducing screen time regularly and before bed allows the mind to relax and prepare for sleep.




In times of stress it is easy to fall into a trap of grabbing comfort food, but it is important to ensure a healthy balanced diet is followed.
